"Ancient Greek Architecture in Sicily" Lecture

The remarkable architectural legacy of the ancient Greeks on the island of Sicily was explored by Allan Langdale, Ph.D. in an illustrated lecture on July 13th. Many of the best preserved Greek temples are found in Sicily. Sites including Syracusa, Agrigento, Segesta, and Selinunte were presented, and Greek temple building and quarrying techniques as practiced by the ancients were surveyed.

Allan Langdale teaches art history at UC Santa Cruz and

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


